Every Wednesday afternoon, students are timetabled to experience enrichment activities which they choose for themselves. We run a number of key courses such as PE, the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme and taught courses such as Japanese. In addition to this, the students are encouraged to run their own enrichment courses - so you could join Astronomy Club, the Debating Society, Film Society, Chess Club, Art Club, Robotics and many others.



Students also have the opportunity to study for their EPQ (Extended Project Qualification). This is an independent academic project which enhances students' research and analytic skills.
