Subject Information

A Level English Literature

The aims of this course are to enable learners to develop their interest in and enjoyment of literature and literary studies as they: read widely and independently both set texts and others that they have selected for themselves; engage creatively with a substantial body of texts and ways of responding to them; develop and effectively apply their knowledge of literary analysis and evaluation in their own creative writing and explore the contexts of the texts they are reading and others' interpretations of them.





Topics studied:

- Shakespeare Poetry pre 1900
- Drama post-1900 Prose post-1900
- Close reading OR recreative writing piece with commentary.
- Comparative essay

Course structure:

- Drama and poetry pre-1900 (01) Marks 60
 Duration 2 hour 30 mins Weighting 40% Closed text exam.
- Comparative and contextual study (02) Marks 60 Duration 2 hour 30 mins Weighting 40% Closed text exam.
- Literature post-1900 (03) Marks 40. 20% Nonexam assessment
