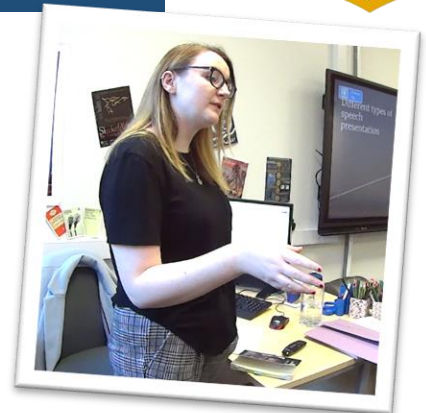




Subject Information

A Level English Language & Literature

Designed with a focus on the integration of language and literature, the English Language and Literature course enables students to see how linguistic and literary methods are related and to explore these links in their work. Offering clear skills progression from GCSE, this course allows students to build on the skills and knowledge already gained and prepare for their next steps.



Topics studied:

- Remembered Places - the representation of place in non-fiction extracts
- Imagined Worlds - point of view and genre in prose fiction
- Poetic Voices - the forms and functions of the poetic voice
- Writing about Society - the role of the individual in society, and re-creative writing based on a set text
- Critical commentary - evaluating own writing
- Dramatic Encounters - conflict and relationships in drama
- Methods of language analysis are integrated into the activities

Course structure:

Paper 1 (Telling Stories): 3 sections, 3 hours. Section A - Remembered Places, Section B - Imagined Worlds, Section C - Poetic Voices. 40% of A-Level

Paper 2 (Exploring Conflict): 2 sections, 2 hours 30 minutes. Section A - Writing about Society, Section B - Dramatic Encounters. 40% of A-Level

Minimum GCSE English grade 6 (language and/or literature)
