

### Macy's Football Journey

Macy started playing football at the age of three, yes three! Probably earlier because ever since she could walk, a football has always been at her feet!

She trained with Cinderford Town youth and when she was around five years old, played her first festival of fun representing them. For five years she played through the age groups with Cinderford where she was the only girl in the team. This never phased her in the slightest, as playing football was all she wanted to do. In the early days, she hit the stigmatism from opposition players and parents thinking "oh it's a girl playing" but they soon realised she was no pushover and gained a lot of respect throughout the grassroots environment in Gloucestershire.



News started to circulate about Macy's abilities and she caught the eye of Cheltenham Town where she trained for a while. Still, she moved to the West Brom development centre where she travelled to Worcester University to train. During this part of the journey, Cinderford

Town put her forward for the Pride of the Forest Awards, she was placed into the young sportsperson category against other successful young people within the Forest of Dean. In March 2017 at the award ceremony, she won the award. A very proud moment for her and the family.

In her last season for Cinderford Town, she scored 54 goals,

along with multiple end-of-season awards. She was the only girl playing in the league at the time and even at an early age she wanted to show other girls that they could do the same!

Age the age of 10 it was time to move on from Cinderford Town youth, she trialled for West Brom and Bristol City academies and luckily was offered a place at both. The decision was made and she chose Bristol City. Here her development has flourished, she joined the under-10 age group playing in a boy's JPL league. Playing against boys all these years shone through and she soon became a mainstay in the side dominating teams whilst playing centre midfield. She also played in goal a couple of times! Showing the other girls that they could mix it against boys culminated in a very successful season for all.



Macy is still at City, now aged 13, this season she has been moved up from the Under 14s as a \*second-year age grouper into the U16s. She has taken this in her stride and her confidence has grown even more. The club recognises her qualities and wants to stretch her learning and

development. \*Bristol City categorise its age group in two-year brackets. One year you play as a young age grouper and the next season you play in your age bracket.

In parallel to her club football she has been recognised by the England FA and for 12 months now has been placed into the England pathway system to represent her country at the international level. England camps start at U15, 16, 17 and beyond, so you never know and with luck, on her side, she may represent England at the full international level and become a lioness.

In the last two seasons, she has also represented her county. Last season they became the southwest of England Under 12 champions.

In 2022 Gloucestershire put her name forward to trial for 2023 England international under 15s schools side where she would be

playing up a year, playing against Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. She successfully navigated herself through two trials culminating in a final trial where a place in the final squad was up for grabs. The final trial involved the best 38 England school girls from the south of England and the north of England. In the final trial, she was honoured to be asked to captain the south which made the day even more special for her.

Unfortunately, she didn't make the final squad and although she was very disappointed she has taken a lot of positives away from the whole experience. One was that she had the privilege of being a captain on the day.

Fingers crossed she is successful next season and can go one squad further.

We hope that sharing this story inspires others to follow in Macy's footsteps, whilst giving her the recognition she rightly deserves for her achievements. Well done Macy and we look forward to watching your career develop.





### Famelab

This term, we held our annual Famelab competition! All Y9 students have a chance to partake in this. They pick a STEM subject and must research it and present it in front of their class, which we know can be daunting, but they all did fantastically! If the book has still not been returned in good condition at the end of the process, it will be necessary to charge for a replacement copy.
