#### **Year 7 - Normandy**

We once again spent time last week at the wonderful Chateau du Molay in Normandy with Year 7 students. The long coach journey is completely worth it for the packed days of adventures and sights to see. On the way to the Chateau, we stopped at the lovely marina town of Honfleur, where students got their first opportunity to experience French culture, practise their language skills and buy traditional French items...you guessed it! Back they all came with bracelets, slushies and the odd baguette!

Day One (full day) - playing with the goats and learning about the cheese-making process on a real French farm.

Following this, we focused on D-Day. We were possibly some of the last groups to visit Pointe du Hoc as it is due to be closed this year due to the erosion that is taking place on the coast. Here, students were able to see the remnants of German defences and the shell holes left by the preparations for D-Day. We also had an unexpected visit from a Eurofighter, which swooped and circled over us, giving us a fantastic demonstration of the noise that fills the air when jets are in it. From here, we moved on to the American cemetery. Students were brilliant as we explained how close they were to Omaha Beach, which you can see from the cemetery, to show just how little land some men were able to take. After this, we moved on to the phenomenal 360-degree cinema, which completely overloads the senses as the sights and sounds of the Normandy invasion surround you. This was followed up by a visit to the newly refurbished D-Day museum in Arromanches to get more details about the Normandy landings.

Following a brilliantly historical afternoon, students were able to wind down back at the chateau with a swimming session, games, tasting frogs legs and snails and then a night of "singing" at the karaoke!

Day Two - In our time machines, we went back almost 1000 years to view the Bayeux Tapestry. Students were blown away by how big the real thing is and the time it would have taken to embroider something so intricately. Free time in Bayeux for ice creams, souvenir shopping and spending time with friends in one of the prettiest French towns.

Miss Adams' most memorable part of every trip was next - the memorial service at the Commonwealth War Cemetery in Bayeux. Mrs Turner, Mr Smith and Miss Taylor all did readings to show the effects of battle on soldiers. Annabel and Heath presented the school's wreath and we had a minute's silence before each student took a cross to lay on a grave. The students represented the school absolutely beautifully and really took the time to honour the fallen. Back to the chateau for more fun and silliness after a more reflective afternoon - team challenges, more swimming and crepe making followed by a disco.

And already we were on the way back home with a stop at a hypermarket to break up the journey.

Well done to all those Year 7 students who went and made the most of it. Importantly, thank you to all the staff who gave up their time to make the trip possible.










#### **Bay of Naples Trip**
