- 1. Beliefs and teachings and Practices Christianity (taught in Year 11)
- 2. Beliefs and teachings and Practices Islam (taught in Year 11)
- 3. Religion, philosophy and ethics in the modern world from a Christian perspective (taught in Year 10)
