Over the next couple of weeks leading up to the game we are going to introduce to you all the girls that are going to lift the cup!!

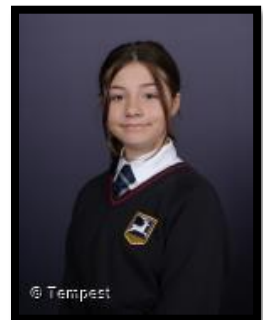
Maci T

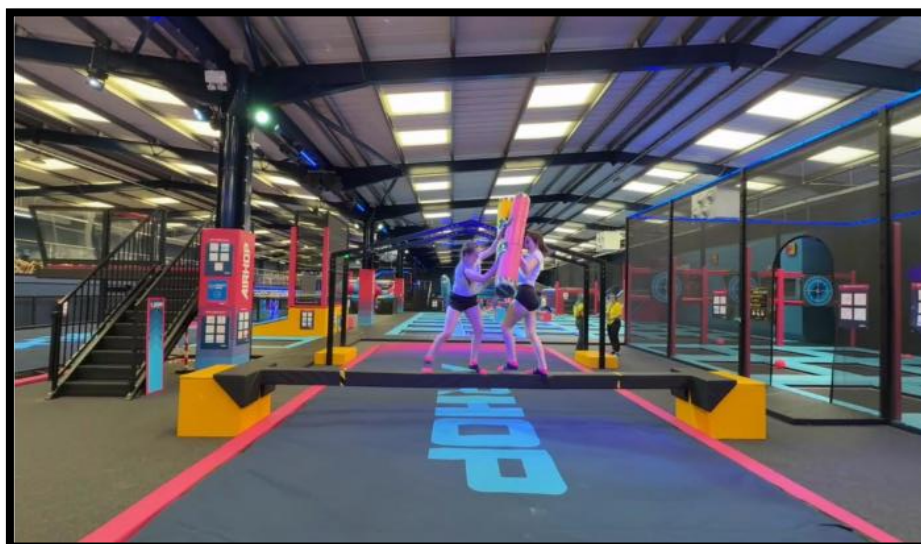


Year 11 Enrichment

Third Place

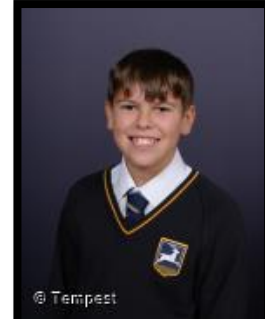
Congratulations to **Millie P and Ruby S (Year 7)**, who performed a beautiful singing duet that completely charmed the audience.

Lessons From Auschwitz Project 2026

One Tuesday, Sky and Ella began the second part of their Lessons from Auschwitz Project which included a daytrip to Krakow, Poland to visit Auschwitz-Birkenau. The day was a long, emotional and tiring one but both students represented the school and 6th form to a high standard by asking questions, reflecting throughout the visit and considering how they will use this visit for the final part of the project.

The trip included a passing visit through Oświęcim, the Polish name for the town that would become known as Auschwitz under German occupation. They then had a two hour tour around Auschwitz with a guide from the Holocaust Education Trust and a local guide from the site who provided expert historical detail. This was then followed by a tour around Birkenau and a memorial service to conclude the day.

Ella and Sky continue to the third part of the project on Sunday with a final seminar. They will then create a project of their choice to become ambassadors for the Holocaust Education Trust.

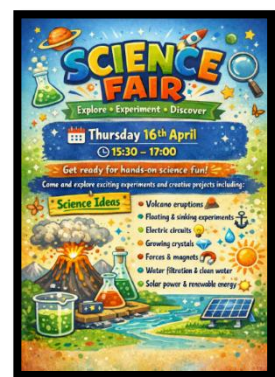

These sessions lead into the club's popular Junior Week during the summer holidays – a fun 5 days of sailing and outdoor activities for 10-17 year olds, keeping them off their devices and active, while building skills and confidence, safely.

If you've been seeking something for your teenager/family to do - sailing is a brilliant option. It's unusual in that 7 year olds, 37 year olds, and 77 year olds can all compete on an equal footing!

Our junior and family programme runs all year round, blending structured training, fun social sailing, friendly racing, and big annual events that bring the whole club together. We're a close-knit, volunteer-run club, and families are always welcome - to sail, to support, or simply to enjoy the atmosphere. Family annual membership (2 adults and all dependent children up to age 18) is just £12 more than single adult membership - or juniors can join by themselves for £51. 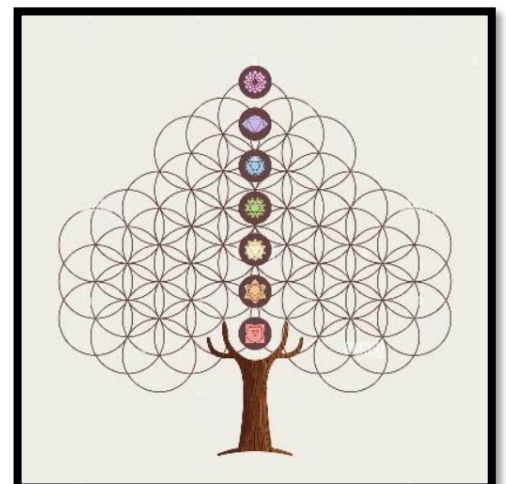

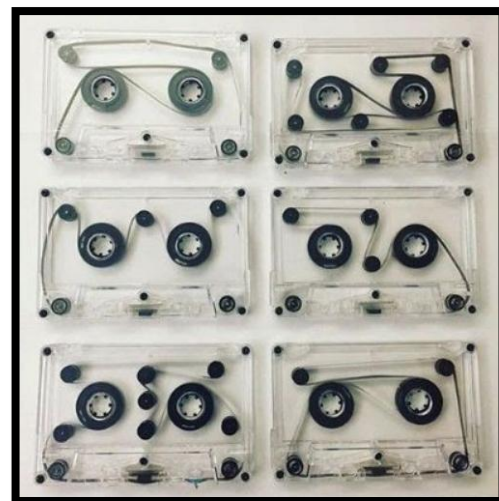

This workshop welcomes all levels of experience — in both yoga and art — and invites a day of gentle discovery, connection, and creative renewal.

On this one-day workshop you'll explore the art of creating tape loop collages. A creative, hands-on process combining sound, memory, and visual art. Using recycled cassette tapes, you'll learn how to cut, splice and loop magnetic tape to create your own sonic artwork. You'll be encouraged to record sounds, voices or ambient textures to develop your own concept, and experiment with collaging the tape itself into tactile visual pieces.

This workshop celebrates the beauty of lo-fi sound and the poetry of reuse; where old media becomes something entirely new. Each participant will take home a unique looping cassette, alongside the skills to keep experimenting. All materials provided (you're welcome to bring an old tape to collage if you wish).


