Dene Magna Crowned Overall Champions at District Athletics Meet

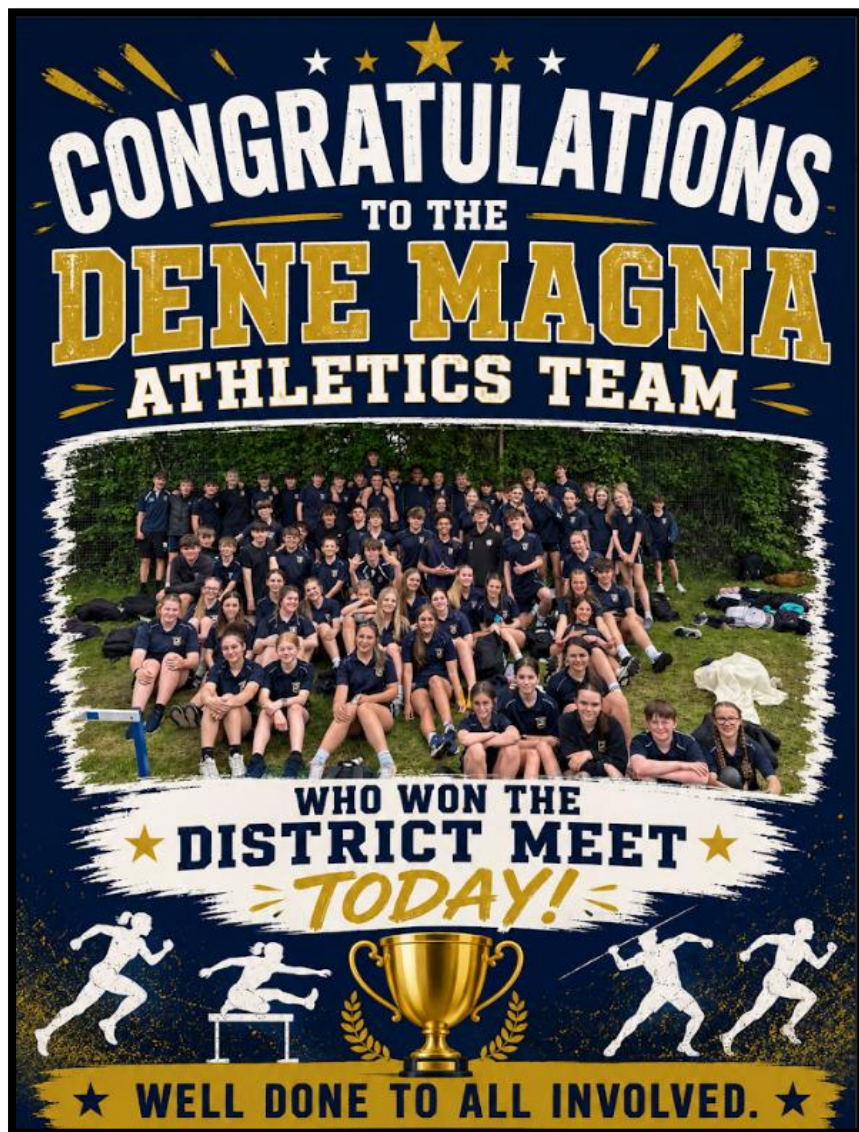

What a fantastic day for our U14 Girls Rugby Team at the Cotswold Girls 7's Tournament!

After last month's incredible achievement of winning the EDF Cup Final at Kingsholm Stadium, the girls once again showed their determination, teamwork, and resilience by finishing runners-up out of 14 schools competing in the tournament.

Our first match was against a very strong and competitive Hans Price School. The girls battled hard throughout the game but unfortunately lost by a single try in a closely fought contest.

The second match saw the team respond brilliantly against Rednock School, producing an outstanding performance to win 6–2.

Confidence continued to grow in the third game against Clevedon School, where the girls played some excellent rugby and secured another impressive victory, winning 5–2.

Following the group stages, the competition split into the Plate, Bowl, and Cup divisions and our girls deservedly progressed into the Cup competition.

In the Cup Semi-Final, we faced familiar opposition in Crypt School, the same team we met in the EDF Cup Final at Kingsholm. In another thrilling encounter, the girls once again came out on top with a fantastic 5–4 victory to book their place in the final.

The Cup Final brought a rematch against Hans Price School. The girls gave everything they had, showing incredible spirit and determination throughout the game. Despite narrowly missing out on the win with a 5–2 result, they should be immensely proud of finishing as runners-up in the entire tournament.

It was a brilliant day of rugby, playing against new teams and competing with such passion and sportsmanship. Every player represented the school superbly, and the whole team were absolutely fantastic from start to finish.



Rugby League and Rugby Sevens

This week has been another fantastic one for the PE department, with excellent performances and attitudes shown across all year groups in rugby league and rugby sevens competitions.

Our Year 7 boys, Year 8 boys, and a combined Year 9 & 10 team travelled to Churchdown to take part in a rugby league tournament, where each team played between five and six matches throughout the day.

The Year 9 & 10 team performed brilliantly and came incredibly close to an unbeaten tournament. Unfortunately, a few unforced errors in key moments prevented them from achieving a clean sweep, but their effort and teamwork were outstanding throughout.



The Year 8 boys competed with great determination and resilience. Although they were unable to secure a win on this occasion, the team gained valuable experience and showed excellent commitment and sportsmanship all day.

The standout achievement of the week came from our Year 7 boys, who won every single game and completed their season unbeaten. As a result, they have qualified for the National Finals Day in London this June, hosted at the home of the London Broncos Rugby League team. This is a fantastic achievement and a fitting reward for what has been a truly exceptional season for the team.

Year 11 & 13 Exam Important Info

Your exams will take place in the Sports Hall, unless you have access arrangements, then you will be in the Gym, unless told differently.

During your exams:

- ❖ You must not have your mobile phone/watch on or any internet enabled devices.
- ❖ You can take a water bottle into the exam room as long as it is clear and free of labels/logos.
- ❖ As soon as you walk into the exam room, you are under formal exam conditions, so no talking.
- ❖ Leave your bags, coats outside the exam room.
- ❖ You must stay until the end of each exam.
- ❖ You will be supervised by invigilators. They are the only people you can talk to in the exam room.

Stationary Allowed in the Exam Room:

- ❖ Black pens not Gel pens (at least 2)
- ❖ HP pencils (at least 2)
- ❖ Protractor
- ❖ Compass
- ❖ Eraser (wrapper removed)
- ❖ Pencil sharpener
- ❖ Ruler
- ❖ Highlighter pens
- ❖ Scientific Calculator (no lid)
- ❖ If using a pencil case it must be transparent.
- ❖ Water bottle (clear no labels)

What You Need To Do Whilst In The Exam:

- ❖ Make sure you sit at the correct desk (look at the seating plan)
- ❖ Check you have the correct exam paper in front of you. Do not write on it until told you can.
- ❖ Place your water bottle on the floor and place the correct equipment on your desk.
- ❖ Read the instructions on the front of the exam paper but do not open it until told you can.
- ❖ Put your hand up if you need to speak to an invigilator
- ❖ Check the time and keep an eye on how long you have left.

I have absolutely loved having Livvy work with me and she has been a real asset assisting with my workshops and I am looking forward to her coming back for a few more days soon.

Attendance: Livvy's attendance and punctuality have been perfect, she is always here at the time agreed without any issues whatsoever.

Conduct and attitude: Livvy's conduct has been extremely professional and she has been very polite, friendly, chatty and a pleasure to have in the studio. She has been working alongside myself and another artist (Jo Snowdon Stained Glass) to develop and deliver workshops and so has been in a classroom environment with approx 16 adult workshop participants, many of which have

commented on how lovely, polite and helpful she was during the day/s. Livvy has done everything we have asked her to do with an enthusiastic and extremely helpful attitude to each task.

Learning: During her time with me so far Livvy has helped me set up for a drypoint workshop and observed me teach 3 other students and also took part herself to create a sample print of an owl that will be used at future workshop I am running with Jo. Towards the end of the session Livvy understood the printing process so was able to help others with their printing which was really helpful. On her next day with me, Livvy helped me set up for a collagraph workshop, once again observing how I teach and she also took part to create her own collagraph print. As the printing process is the same as drypoint, Livvy gave a practical demonstration to the other participants while I talked through the steps, she also helped the group with their printing towards the end of the workshop without being asked.

On day 3 we travelled over to Lydney to Jo Snowdon's studio. During this day Livvy helped us make a stained glass frame which would be the surround for the owl print she had created on the drypoint workshop. She learned to cut, foil and solder stained glass to make the final piece which has been used for our marketing online and for leaflets and posters. She then helped us set up for a tulip themed combo workshop we were running the following day. On day 4 Livvy came back to Lydney with me where she assisted both Jo and I with the tulip combo. We had 10 participants who came to learn how to create a stained glass tulip and a tulip linocut print. Livvy was also tasked to take photos and video clips of the day which we later used to compile a reel for our social media.

Livvy has worked really hard and I hope has learned a lot about some of the areas of running a business as a full time artist/tutor. It has also been a privilege to see some of the work she has created with me and I am very much looking forward to our next day together.

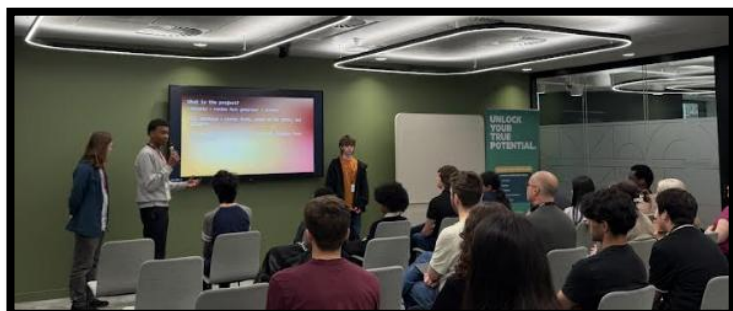


Edward M completed his work experience at Hewlett Packard Enterprise (HPE), he received great feedback

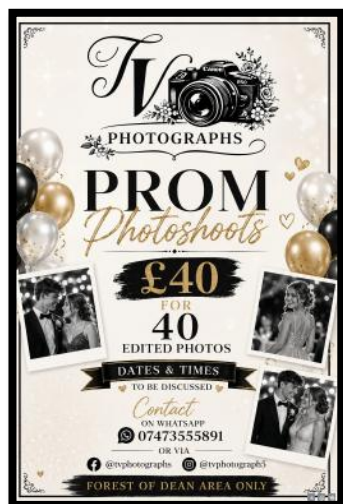
