### **Girls' Rugby Triumphs Once Again**

#### **Golden Fern Cup Rugby League 9s**

We had the pleasure of taking 37 Dene Magna students to Churchdown School on Wednesday to compete in the Golden Fern Cup Rugby League 9s tournament.



Our Year 7 team were outstanding from the very beginning. They opened the tournament with an impressive 8–0 victory over Churchdown School, showing excellent tackling, strong defence, and not conceding a single try. They continued their winning form against Archway School with a 7–2 victory, demonstrating determination, resilience, and teamwork throughout. The girls then finished the group stages with a fantastic 6–1 win over Oasis Academy Bristol. Winning the tournament and playing at the finals in London. Every player showed exceptional sportsmanship and true Dene Magna spirit. The team has now qualified for the Rugby League Southern Finals at the Hazelwood Training Centre, home of the London Broncos, on Tuesday 23rd June.



Our Year 8 team were pushed to their limits throughout the day. With only five experienced rugby players in the squad, the rest of the team was made up of committed and enthusiastic sporty girls eager to make a difference. They started strongly with a 7–1 win against Churchdown School, tackling hard and turning the ball over to their advantage, before facing a very strong Orchard School side. The match was fiercely contested from start to finish and ended in a thrilling 4–4 draw. Going into the final game, the team knew they needed a big result to stand a chance of reaching the finals. They certainly did not disappoint, producing a superb 10–2 victory to secure their place in the finals in London. The Year 8 team will now compete in the Rugby League Southern Finals at the Hazelwood Training Centre on Thursday 25th June.



The Year 9 and 10 team also delivered an outstanding performance throughout the tournament. They played with determination, resilience, and excellent teamwork from start to finish. Their opening match against Churchdown School was a close and highly competitive contest, but through hard tackling, strong communication, and relentless effort, the girls battled their way to a superb 4–3 victory.

They carried this momentum into their next game against Archway School, where their physical defence, powerful tackling, and ability to work together as a team proved too strong for the opposition, resulting in an impressive 6–2 win. In their final match against Oasis Academy Bristol, the girls once again showed incredible spirit and determination, fighting hard for every ball and supporting one another throughout to secure a well-deserved 4–2 victory.

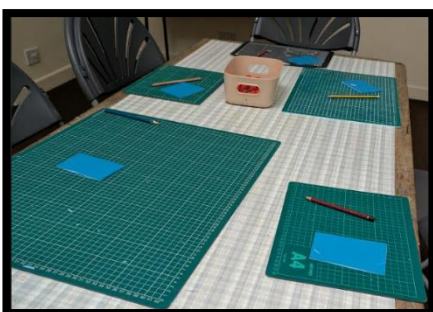


## Nature In Art

The students were a credit to the school throughout the trip and should be congratulated for their excellent behaviour, politeness, and positive attitude.



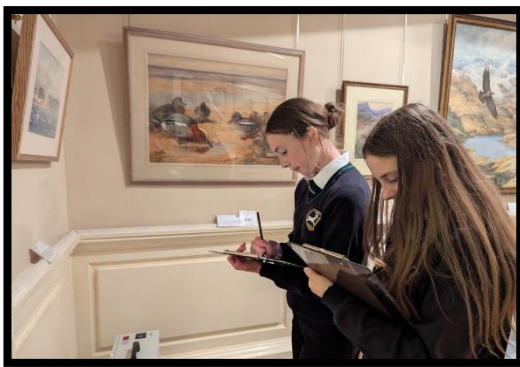
Feedback from the students was very positive, please read the comments below:

## Literacy Matters

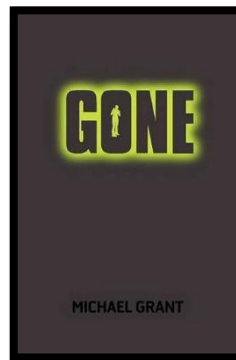
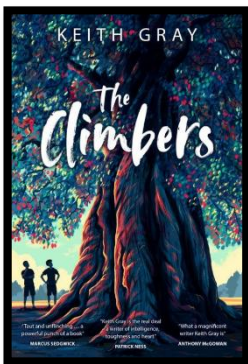
### National Year of Reading: Go All In

Your exams will take place in the Sports Hall, unless you have access arrangements, then you will be in the Gym, unless told differently.

### During your exams:

- ❖ You must not have your mobile phone/watch on or any internet enabled devices.
- ❖ You can take a water bottle into the exam room as long as it is clear and free of labels/logos.
- ❖ As soon as you walk into the exam room, you are under formal exam conditions, so no talking.
- ❖ Leave your bags, coats outside the exam room.
- ❖ You must stay until the end of each exam.
- ❖ You will be supervised by invigilators. They are the only people you can talk to in the exam room.

### Stationary Allowed in the Exam Room:

- ❖ Black pens not Gel pens (at least 2)
- ❖ HP pencils (at least 2)
- ❖ Protractor
- ❖ Compass
- ❖ Eraser (wrapper removed)
- ❖ Pencil sharpener

- ❖ Scientific Calculator (no lid)
- ❖ If using a pencil case it must be transparent.
- ❖ Water bottle (clear no labels)

### What You Need To Do Whilst In The Exam:

- ❖ Make sure you sit at the correct desk (look at the seating plan)
- ❖ Check you have the correct exam paper in front of you.  
Do not write on it until told you can.
- ❖ Place your water bottle on the floor and place the correct equipment on your desk.
- ❖ Read the instructions on the front of the exam paper but do not open it until told you can.
- ❖ Put your hand up if you need to speak to an invigilator
- ❖ Check the time and keep an eye on how long you have left.

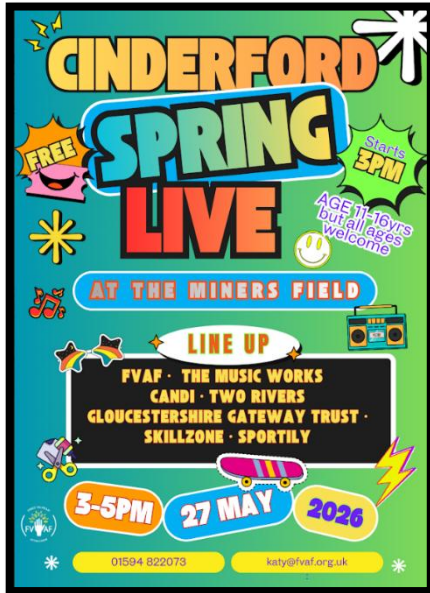

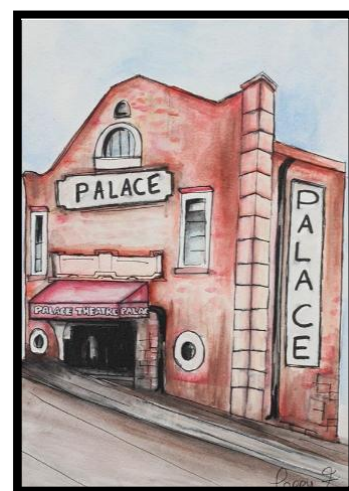
