### Tutor Reading Programme:

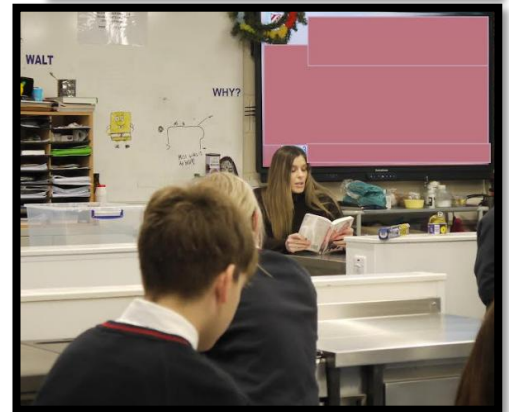
This week we have more to share on the Tutor reading programme.

As a teacher reads to their tutor group, students are developing greater vocabulary and comprehension through a variety of interesting texts that expand their worldview and improve their literacy.

10D1 and Mrs Jarvis have been reading 'We See Everything' by William Sutcliffe. Set in a dystopian future where London's inhabitants are under constant surveillance and forbidden to go past the perimeter, the lives of two teens are moving closer together despite having never met: one has just been recruited as a drone pilot and the other is hiding a secret from the Authority. A tense thriller, this book draws you into the lives of two people who could have been friends but find themselves on opposite sides and it seems there is no escape for either.



Mrs Witts and 8J2 were reading 'Dog Runner' by Bren MacDibble where half-siblings Ella and Emery face a bleak choice: starve to death in a city or risk travelling to find Emery's mum and hope life may be better there. So begins an incredible adventure as the two set out on their over-land dog sled to cross Australia and survive but nothing is easy and that is certainly true in this story as they discover the extremes to which people will go when the food runs out. The only question is: will any of them make it? Why not ask them for some spoilers?

## Year 11 Information

As we approach the end of the academic year, I would be really appreciated if you could help the Youth Support Team by sharing the attached letter with the parent/carers of your Year 11 leavers. The letter outlines Gloucestershire County Council's statutory duties to track young people's education, training, and employment destinations after Year 11, and explains how the Youth Support Team may make contact where needed. This is to avoid confusion and provide reassurance to parents / carers upon our initial contact.

Dear Parent / Carer,

This correspondence is from the Youth Support Team, part of Gloucestershire County Council. As your child has completed Year 11, we would like to take the opportunity to inform you of Gloucestershire County Council's duties under the Education and Skills Act 2008 to keep track of your child's education, training, and employment destination status. We have a duty to keep track of your child's status up until 31/08/2028. We receive the majority of the information we require from Gloucestershire's 6<sup>th</sup> forms, colleges, and training providers enrolments list. If your child does not enrol in a Gloucestershire 6<sup>th</sup> form, college, or training provider we may have to make contact with you or your child to enquire about your child's destination. We may contact you with via phone, text, email, or letter between the hours of 9am and 7pm.

The most common reasons why we make direct:

- Your child enrolls in an institution outside of Gloucestershire.
- Your child enrolls in an independent school
- Your child enrolls late
- Your child moves into employment or an apprenticeship.
- Your child leaves an institution during the academic year.
- Your child becomes NEET (Not in education, training or employment)

## Year 11 & 13 Exam Important Info

Your exams will take place in the Sports Hall, unless you have access arrangements, then you will be in the Gym, unless told differently.

### During your exams:

- ❖ You must not have your mobile phone/watch on or any internet enabled devices.
- ❖ You can take a water bottle into the exam room as long as it is clear and free of labels/logos.
- ❖ As soon as you walk into the exam room, you are under formal exam conditions, so no talking.
- ❖ Leave your bags, coats outside the exam room.
- ❖ You must stay until the end of each exam.
- ❖ You will be supervised by invigilators. They are the only people you can talk to in the exam room.

### Stationary Allowed in the Exam Room:

- ❖ Black pens not Gel pens (at least 2)
- ❖ HP pencils (at least 2)

- ❖ Protractor
- ❖ Compass
- ❖ Eraser (wrapper removed)
- ❖ Pencil sharpener
- ❖ Ruler
- ❖ Highlighter pens
- ❖ Scientific Calculator (no lid)
- ❖ If using a pencil case it must be transparent.
- ❖ Water bottle (clear no labels)

### What You Need To Do Whilst In The Exam:

- ❖ Make sure you sit at the correct desk (look at the seating plan)
- ❖ Check you have the correct exam paper in front of you.  
Do not write on it until told you can.
- ❖ Place your water bottle on the floor and place the correct equipment on your desk.
- ❖ Read the instructions on the front of the exam paper but do not open it until told you can.
- ❖ Put your hand up if you need to speak to an invigilator
- ❖ Check the time and keep an eye on how long you have left.

There will be a seating plan for every exam. You will sit in alphabetical order by surname, grouped by exam or by class, so for example:

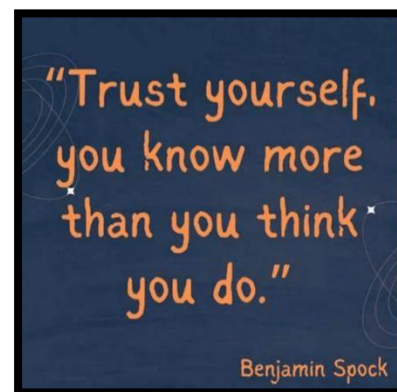
In Science Biology, there will be 3 groups:

- ❖ The invigilator will ask you to place all lined paper inside the exam booklet, so please make sure your name is on every additional sheet of paper.
- ❖ You cannot leave until all papers are handed in, so please be patient.
- ❖ You will be dismissed in silence a row at a time and asked to leave through the same door you entered.
- ❖ Exams finish at different times so please be mindful that others could still be working.
- ❖ You must not talk until you have left the room.

## Careers Breakfast

We'd like to extend a huge thank you to Jo Jackson who spoke to our Year 12's this week about her very interesting squiggly career. Jo is a civil servant in the Food Standards Agency with a background that spans clinical practice, microbiology, and public health. She started her career in a university microbiology teaching and research lab, completing an MSc & PhD in microbiology before joining the NHS. She then spent 17 years as an Anaesthesia Associate, working in a front line clinical role before moving into scientific roles within government, where she started in microbiological risk assessment working on projects including avian influenza in cattle, and a large outbreak of E. coli linked to prepacked sandwiches. Her work now focuses on incident prevention, bringing together science, operational insight, and clear communication to support national decision making.

### **Year 12 Business Students explore University of Gloucestershire**

Thinking about where your business ambitions might take you after school? Dene Magna 6th Form Business students spent an immersive day at the University of Gloucestershire, getting a genuine taste of campus life and discovering how passion translates into a degree.

The day was packed with interactive sessions, first-hand insights, and a look at what the future could hold.

Here is what went down:

- A dive into the Business World - The core of the visit was a series of hands-on, interactive taster sessions designed to simulate the real student experience. Students rotated through four dynamic areas:
- Business & Management: Exploring how modern companies innovate, scale, and solve complex global challenges.
- Marketing: Deconstructing branding strategies and looking at how digital trends influence consumer behaviour.
- Accounting & Finance: Decoding the numbers behind the world's biggest brands and seeing how financial strategy drives success.
- Sport Business: A look into the multi-billion-dollar sports industry, focusing on event management, sponsorship, and sports marketing.



These sessions gave everyone a chance to apply their classroom knowledge to real-world scenarios, proving that business at the university level is collaborative, fast-paced, and highly practical.

### **Real Talk**

Prospectuses are great, but it is another to hear it from someone who is actually living it. The class met with current university students who shared an honest, inspiring look at their journey. From balancing lectures and coursework to making new friends, joining societies, and managing a student budget; this session gave our Year 12s a roadmap of what to expect. The takeaway? University is about much more than just a degree—it is about independence and personal growth.

### **Exploring the Campus**

The day wrapped up with a guided campus tour. Walking through the modern lecture theatres, high-tech study spaces, and vibrant social hubs, the students could truly picture themselves walking these halls in a couple of years. Seeing the universities cutting-edge facilities first-hand took the mystery out of higher education and left the class feeling motivated to finish Year 12 strong.

### **The Verdict**
