Update on GCSEs

As you will be aware GCSE and Vocational qualifications have been severely disrupted over the last two years. In October OFQUAL (the exams regulator) published details about how grades will be assessed in 2022. The most important thing to note is that the strong intention is that exams <u>will</u> happen in 2022 for both GCSE and A Levels.

There are some small changes that are designed to acknowledge the disruption that has taken place for the cohort. The subjects that this applies to are aware of these and have built them into their planning.

With regards to outcomes, these are monitored nationally and the plan is that they will take into account grades achieved by students from 2019-21. The impact of this is that your daughters and sons will not be disadvantaged because of disruption to their learning.

There is also a contingency plan to use Teacher Assessed grades (as in 2021), however the hope is that this will not be necessary.

As always, the key factor in making great progress is how hard each student works. We are very lucky that Dene Magna students understand this well and are already stepping up to the challenge of achieving the best outcomes that they can in 2022.

Year 11 Trial Exams

Trial Exams will be running from 15 November. We cannot over emphasise how important these exams are. They will provide students with another 'practice' for their final exams as well as allowing teachers to identify where the gaps are in skills, knowledge and exam technique. The key though, is to develop confidence and ensure that students feel prepared and secure in their knowledge and processes as they approach May and June 2022.

It is essential that, as well as doing trial exams, each student does 'trial revision'. If they do not do this it is similar to turning up to a dress rehearsal for a play without having learnt their lines.

We will be working on revision skills with Year 11 and Mr Derrick will also be leading a session with parents/carers during the Parent/Carer Information Evening on 21 October (see over for more information).

Each year we also have a 'Trial Results Day'. Results will be collected by students, just like they will in August 2022. The date for this is Thursday 6 January and we will send out further information closer to the time.

A huge thank you to staff, students and Parents/carers for making this work so well. It is such a crucial opportunity to ensure that each teacher gets more face to face time with their classes in the run up to Trial Exams.

Your continued support is very much appreciated. We know that these sessions work and have a real impact in filling the gaps in knowledge and going over learning from earlier in the course. As the year progresses we will make these sessions more and more focussed, however at the moment the priority is that all students are there and learning.

Year 11 Enrichment

Enrichment is a big thing for Year 11. We have invested more time and opportunities to give Year 11s a broad range of experiences in their Core PE lessons. This is giving students the chance to learn new skills as well as brush cobwebs off some old ones.

As we come out of lockdown, we feel it is important to ensure that students live an active physical life, as well as working hard on their academic studies. Hopefully Wednesday afternoons will enable them to catch up on some of the opportunities that they missed over the last two years.





Enrichment is off to a great

start, with multiple options available to students on a Wednesday afternoon. Over 30 students have headed off site for skiing and golf as well as a broad range of activities on site. There are still places available for off site activities, please get in touch with any member of the PE Department for information on how to join in with these sessions. The current activities will be running up until Christmas.
