**Impact** We know our curriculum is working in the Music department through the engagement of our students that can be seen in all lessons. KS3 project work regularly shows good and exceptional understanding. Teaching and learning in the department is good and can be evidenced through positive internal learning walks. We have a healthy uptake at GCSE and regularly have 10% or more of a year group opt to take the subject. Our GCSE results are very positive and we have seen 45% of our students achieving levels 8 or 9 in the last year. Our instrumental tuition provision is successful. Retention is very good with many students continuing to learn an instrument throughout their time at Dene Magna. The majority of students who choose to be entered for instrumental examinations through both Trinity and ABRSM are successful. The impact of our extra-curricular provision can be seen throughout the school. Dene Magna has a reputation for providing its students with endless opportunities to perform and engage in music making at a high standard. We have a good number of students who are committed in their membership of the various musical ensembles. Regular concerts (3 a year for Music) in school give students the opportunity to display their talents and we receive regular compliments from audiences regarding the level of musicality with which our students are able to perform. As a department we firmly believe that it is the enjoyment of the students and staff alongside their commitment and enthusiasm to make music which drives the department's success.
